

Hamlet of Kugluktuk
By-law No. 207

A **BYLAW** of the Municipal Corporation of the Hamlet of Kugluktuk to regulate the control, use and operation of all-terrain vehicles within the municipal boundaries, pursuant to the provisions of the **All-Terrain Vehicles Act**, R.S.N.W.T.1988 c. A-3, ss. 5-7; the **Motor Vehicles Act**, R.S.N.W.T.1988, c. M-16, s.347 and the **Hamlets Act**, R.S.N.W.T. 1988, c. H-1, s. 173 as adopted by the Government of Nunavut pursuant to the **Nunavut Act**.

AS it is desirable to regulate the operation of all-terrain vehicles within the Hamlet,

NOW THEREFORE, the Council of the Hamlet of Kugluktuk, at a duly assembled meeting, enacts as follows:

SHORT TITLE

1. This Bylaw may be cited as the "A.T.V. Bylaw".

INTERPRETATION

2. In this Bylaw:
- a) "Accident" means an accident involving an all-terrain vehicle on or adjacent to a highway or other areas within the Hamlet that results in:
 - i) the injury or death of a person; or
 - ii) total damages to all property involved in the accident appear to be \$ 1,000 or more.
 - b) "All-Terrain Vehicle" means a motorized vehicle that runs on wheels, tracks, skis, air cushions or any combination of wheels, tracks, skis or air cushions and is designed for cross-country travel on land, water, snow, ice or on other natural terrain and, without limiting the generality of this definition, includes:
 - i) an amphibious vehicle,
 - ii) a snowmobile
 - iii) a motorized vehicle mounted on three or four wheels,
 - iv) a pedal bicycle with motor attachment, and
 - v) any other vehicle prescribed to be included but does not include any vehicle that weighs more than 900 kg., a special all-terrain vehicle or any other vehicle prescribed as an exception to this definition.
 - c) "Application for Registration" means an application to register a snowmobile as per schedule "A" attached to and forming part of this by-law.
 - d) "Certificate of Registration" means a certificate of registration or interim certificate of registration issued either pursuant to this bylaw, as per schedule "B" attached to and forming part of this bylaw, or PART III of the **All Terrain Vehicles Act**.
 - e) "Council" means the Council of the Hamlet of Kugluktuk.
 - f) "Driver" means a person who operates or is in actual physical control of an all-terrain vehicle.

- g) "Driver's Licence" means a valid driver's:
 - i) permit issued under this bylaw, or
 - ii) license issued under the *Motor Vehicles Act*; or
 - iii) license issued in a jurisdiction outside the Nunavut Territory.
- h) "Elder" means any person who is fifty-five (55) years of age or older.
- i) "Hamlet" means the Hamlet of Kugluktuk in the Nunavut Territory.
- j) "Hamlets Act" means the *Hamlets Act* RSNWT (1988) c.H-1.
- k) "Highway" means a highway as defined by the *Motor Vehicles Act*.
- l) "Helmet" means a rigid safety helmet bearing one or more of the following certification labels:
 - i) CSA D-230,
 - ii) DOT 218, or
 - iii) SNELL M90
- m) "Insurance" means public liability coverage that insures at least to the limits required by sec. 144 of the Insurance Act. R.S.N.W.T. 1988,c.I-4
- n) "License Plate" means:
 - i) in reference to a Special All-Terrain Vehicle, a license plate issued pursuant to PART III of the *All-Terrain Vehicles Act*, or
 - ii) in reference to snowmobiles a registration number issued or approved by the Hamlet of Kugluktuk
- o) " Mutatis Mutandis" means with the respective differences having been considered.
- p) "Night" means thirty (30) minutes after sunset and ends thirty (30) minutes before sunrise.
- q) "Owner" means the person or corporation who has legal title to the all-terrain vehicle.
- r) "Peace Officer" means:
 - i) a member of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police;
 - ii) a By-Law Officer appointed by the Hamlet of Kugluktuk.
- s) "Pedestrian" means a person on foot or in a wheelchair and includes a child in a carriage or carried.
- t) "Prohibited Area" means an area of the Hamlet, as per schedule "C" attached to and forming part of this bylaw, where the use of all-terrain vehicles is forbidden 24 hours a day, everyday.
- u) "Registrar" means:
 - i) in the case of an all-terrain vehicle the SAO, or a person authorized to act on the SAO's behalf, or
 - ii) in the case of a special all-terrain vehicle, the registrar as referred to in the *All-Terrain Vehicles Act*.
- v) "Restricted Area" means an area of the Hamlet, as per schedule "D" attached to and forming part of this bylaw, where all-terrain vehicles

cannot operate between the hours of 8AM – 5PM, Monday through Friday.

- w) "S.A.O" means the Senior Administrative Officer of the Hamlet of Kugluktuk.
- x) "Snowmobile" means a motorized vehicle that runs on tracks or skis or any combination thereof, weighs less than 900 kilograms and is designed to be driven primarily on snow or ice or both.
- y) "Special All-Terrain Vehicle" means an all-terrain vehicle that operates on three (3) or four (4) wheels (e.g. Honda 4-Trax 300).
- z) "Traffic Control Device" means a sign or device erected by authority of Council or official having jurisdiction for the purpose of regulating, warning or guiding traffic.
- aa) "Vehicle" means any vehicle designed to travel on land that is drawn, propelled or driven by any kind of power and includes all-terrain vehicles.

REGISTRATION

- 3.1 No person shall operate an all terrain vehicle within the Hamlet unless it has been registered and has affixed visibly on the vehicle the license plate and year numerals for the current license year.
- 3.2 The license year runs from April 1 through to March 31 of the following year.
- 3.3 The attached application for registration (schedule "A") shall be completed in full for all snowmobile owners in the Hamlet.
- 3.4 Registration Fees shall be paid as per schedule "E" attached to and forming part of this bylaw.
- 3.5 A certificate of registration expires upon:
 - a) Change of ownership, or
 - b) Death of the registered owner.
- 3.6 Where a certificate of registration expires under Section 3.4, the new owner shall within ten (10) days notify the registrar of the transfer of ownership.
- 3.7 The onus of placing the license and/or registration letters or numbers on an appropriate, easily visible location on the all-terrain vehicle rests with the owner.
- 3.8 A snowmobile which has a valid registration issued in another jurisdiction shall be considered valid and registered under this by-law for a period of one (1) month from the date on which the snowmobile was brought into the Hamlet. At the end of which time the owner must register his snowmobile with the registrar.
- 3.9 The Registrar may refuse to issue a certificate of registration to an owner who has been required to pay a fine for contravention of any by-laws of the Hamlet, where the time allowed for payment has passed and the fine is outstanding.

PUBLIC LIABILITY INSURANCE

- 4.1 No person shall operate a special all-terrain vehicle on a highway or other areas within the Hamlet unless there is in force a policy of Public Liability Insurance.
- 4.2 The onus of proving that a special all-terrain vehicle is covered by insurance shall be on the registered owner.

LICENCE REQUIREMENTS

- 5.1 No person under the age fourteen (14) years shall operate an all-terrain vehicle.
- 5.2 No person shall operate an all-terrain vehicle on a highway within the Hamlet unless that person has been issued an:
 - a) All-Terrain Vehicles Driver's Permit issued under this by-law, or
 - b) Driver's License issued pursuant to the *Motor Vehicles Act*.
- 5.3 License and Exam Fees shall be paid as per schedule "E" attached to and forming part of this bylaw.
- 5.4 Criteria for obtaining a Driver's Permit to operate an all-terrain vehicle:
 - a) Be at least fourteen (14) years of age,
 - b) Completed application form as per schedule "F" attached to and forming part of this bylaw,
 - c) Signed consent form from parent or guardian (if between the ages of 14-16),
 - d) Obtain a passing mark of eighty (80%) percent on the attached Exam (schedule "G" attached to and forming part of this bylaw).
- 5.5 The exam fee shall be non-refundable and must be paid prior to writing the exam.
- 5.5 The Driver's Permit is valid from the date of issue through to March 31 of the following year.
- 5.7 Driver's Permit holders have until April 30 after the date of expiry to renew their permit.
- 5.8 Driver's Permit holders who don't renew their permit by April 30 will have to rewrite the Driver's Exam.

RULES OF OPERATION

- 6.1 No person shall operate an all-terrain vehicle within the Hamlet:
 - a) at a speed greater than 30 km/hr except as otherwise posted,
 - b) on any playground designated as a prohibited area,
 - c) on any school property designated as a restricted area,
 - d) under the influence of alcohol and/or controlled substances as set out in the *Criminal Code of Canada*,
 - e) on the left side of the highway, except when safely overtaking or passing another vehicle
 - f) in a stunt or activity that is likely to distract or startle another driver or pedestrian, without due care and attention,
 - g) in a race or contest of performance,
 - h) behind another vehicle more closely than is reasonable in the circumstances,
 - i) to drive over unprotected fire hoses, and
 - j) where signs prohibit its use.

- 6.2 No person shall operate an all-terrain vehicle within the Hamlet:
- a) without a helmet, except for snowmobiles, and
 - b) with more than 2 persons seated at a time on the vehicle.
- 6.3 Where an infant is within an amauti or any other device designed for carrying infants that is worn by the driver or passenger, the infant is not a person for the purposes of sec. 6.2(b).
- 6.4 No person shall operate any all-terrain vehicle within the Hamlet while carrying any object in a manner that will obstruct or interfere with:
- a) the operation of the vehicle, or
 - b) the view of the driver, or
 - c) the object extends in such a manner as to present a hazard to the public.
- 6.5 Every driver of an all-terrain vehicle:
- a) shall obey the command that is set out in words or by signals or symbols on a traffic control device, unless the driver is otherwise directed to do so by a peace officer;
 - b) approaching an intersection where there is no traffic control device shall yield the right of way to traffic and/or pedestrians within the intersection;
 - c) shall dim their headlights (put onto low-beam) when approaching oncoming traffic.
- 6.6 No person shall:
- a) abandon or leave any all-terrain vehicle in a manner so as to obstruct any other driver on any highway within the Hamlet;
 - b) park an all-terrain vehicle on private property without the expressed consent from the owner or occupant in charge or control of the said property;
 - c) tow a person on a bicycle, coaster, sled, toboggan, skateboard, ice skates, roller skates or skis.
- 6.7 Notwithstanding Section 6.6 (c), a person may tow a sled or komatik behind an all-terrain vehicle if the tether is shortened to reasonably control the sled within the lane of travel.

ACCIDENTS

- 7.1 When an accident occurs on or adjacent to a highway within the Hamlet, each driver of an all-terrain vehicle that is directly or indirectly involved in the accident shall, if he or she is capable of doing so:
- a) remain at the scene of the accident;
 - b) render all reasonable assistance;
 - c) contact a peace officer;
 - d) provide the following information, in writing to a peace officer:
 - i) name and address,
 - ii) operator's license number,
 - iii) insurance (if applicable) and registration.

- 7.2 Notwithstanding Section 7.1(a), the driver of an all-terrain vehicle that is directly or indirectly involved in an accident may leave the scene of the accident
- a) after the driver has performed the duties imposed by Section 7.1, or
 - b) for the purpose of obtaining assistance.
- 7.3 The driver who leaves the scene of an accident under Section 7.2(b) shall, after obtaining or attempting to obtain assistance,
- a) return immediately to the scene of the accident and comply with section 7.1; or
 - b) immediately make a report in writing that contains the information described in Section 7.1(d).

EQUIPMENT

8. Every all-terrain vehicle that is operated on a highway within the Hamlet at night must be equipped with:
- a) a headlight at the front that projects a white light for a distance of 100m,
 - b) a tail light at the rear that shows a red light visible at a distance of at least 150 m,
 - c) at least one braking system in good working order, and
 - d) an operating muffler designed to suppress engine noise.

HOURS OF OPERATION

- 9.1 No driver shall operate an all-terrain vehicle within the Hamlet between the hours of 12 midnight and 7:00 AM.
- 9.2 Operation of an all-terrain vehicle for the purposes of subsistence hunting, trapping, fishing, work or emergencies shall be exempt from Section 9.1.
- 9.3 Under Section 9.2, all travel must be made by the most direct route.
- 9.4 Council may by resolution designate other exceptions from time to time.

ENFORCEMENT

- 10.1 Where any driver of an all-terrain vehicle (that has committed an offence) is unknown to the peace officer, the registered owner of the vehicle shall at the request of a peace officer, supply within forty-eight (48) hours the name of the person in charge of the vehicle at the time in question.
- 10.2 It is an offence if the registered owner proves that the all-terrain vehicle mentioned in Section 10.1 was operated without his/her knowledge.
- 10.3 A peace officer may, at any time, stop and inspect an all-terrain vehicle that is on the highway within the Hamlet to ascertain whether the all-terrain vehicle complies with this bylaw with respect to registration, licensing, insurance and equipment.
- 10.4 It is an offence for a driver to disobey the commands of the peace officer acting under Section 10.3 of this bylaw.
- 10.5 The driver of a stopped all-terrain vehicle and any passenger(s) shall provide all assistance within their power to the peace officer.

- 10.6 A driver who has stopped the all-terrain vehicle that he/she is operating pursuant to Section 10.3 shall not move the all-terrain vehicle until instructed to do so by a peace officer.
- 10.7 Any driver stopped under Section 10.3 shall provide on demand by a peace officer, proof of insurance (if applicable), registration and driver's license.
- 10.8 A driver, failing to comply under Section 10.7, shall have 48 hours to produce the requested documents or be charged for failure to produce the requested documents.
- 10.9 Where a peace officer has conducted an inspection under Section 10.3, and believes the all-terrain vehicle is in a condition to endanger the safety of the public, the peace officer shall:
- a) remove the license plate; or
 - b) direct the driver to remove the all-terrain vehicle from the highway.
- 10.10 Where a peace officer on reasonable grounds believes that the ability of a driver of an all-terrain vehicle on a highway within the Hamlet is adversely affected because the driver
- a) has consumed alcohol or otherwise introduced alcohol or any other drug into his or her body, or
 - b) is fatigued, or
 - c) any combination of the above;
- the peace officer may:
- d) in the case of a driver operating an all-terrain vehicle on a highway, direct the person to stop and park the all-terrain vehicle, and
 - e) direct the driver to surrender his or her driver's license.
- 10.11 It is an offence for a driver to disobey the commands of the peace officer acting under Section 10.10 of this bylaw.
- 10.12 Where a peace officer requests a driver to surrender his or her operator's license under Section 10.10, the license issued under this by-law is suspended for four to 24 hours, as may be determined by the peace officer.
- 10.13 A peace officer who directs a driver to surrender his or her driver's license under Section 10.10 shall immediately provide the driver with a certificate that sets out
- a) whether the Peace Officer believes the ability of the driver to operate an all-terrain vehicle is adversely affected because of alcohol, fatigue or any or all of these factors,
 - b) the length of the suspension, and
 - c) where the driver's license can be picked up after the suspension expires.
- 10.14 No person shall obstruct, molest or interfere with a peace officer in the performance of his or her duties with respect to the enforcement of this bylaw.
- 10.15 Peace Officers, may, at their discretion, issue a warning or seize an all-terrain vehicle for putting resident safety at risk within the Hamlet.
- a) First offense – Written warning
 - b) Second offense the Peace Officer may seize the all-terrain vehicle for a period of twenty four (24) hours.

- c) Third offense the Peace Officer may seize the all-terrain vehicle for a period of fourteen (14) days.
- d) Fourth offense the Peace Officer may seize the all-terrain vehicle for a period of thirty (30) days.

The owner of the all-terrain vehicle may reclaim the vehicle at the end of the period of seizure and when all towing and storage fees have been paid.

FALSE STATEMENT

- 11. No person shall knowingly make a false statement in any application, declaration, affidavit, report or any other document that is submitted to the Registrar or a Peace Officer under this bylaw.

DUTY OF OWNER

- 12. No owner of an all-terrain vehicle shall allow the all-terrain vehicle to be operated within the Hamlet by a person who is not authorized by this bylaw to operate that vehicle.

PENALTIES

- 13.1 Any person violating any provision of this bylaw is guilty of an offence and is liable upon summary conviction to a fine as prescribed in schedule "H" attached to and forming part of this bylaw.
- 13.2 Any person who has received notice in the form of a ticket in conformance with the **Summary Convictions Procedures Act**, may pay to the Hamlet of Kugluktuk within fourteen (14) days after receipt of such notice, the voluntary payment specified in schedule "H" in lieu of prosecution for any breach of this bylaw.
- 13.3 Failing to make voluntary payment and failing to appear before a court of competent jurisdiction to answer to a charge under this bylaw, the person charged of the offence appearing in the said notice shall be subject to a fine as set out in schedule "H".
- 13.4 A judge or J.P. who convicts a person of an offence under or finds a person guilty of contravening sections 5.2, 6.1(a), 6.1(d) or 10.4, may by order, prohibit the person from operating an all-terrain vehicle for a period not exceeding six (6) months.

SEVERABILITY

- 14. If any provisions of this bylaw is declared invalid because of any word, phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, section or any documents that may form part of this by-law or an application thereof to any person or circumstance is declared invalid, the remaining provisions and the application thereof shall not be affected and shall remain in full force.

MUTATIS MUTANDIS

- 15. Where an offence under this bylaw is in respect to a section thereof passed pursuant to the **All-Terrain Vehicles Act**, the provisions of the **Summary Convictions Procedures Act** shall apply mutatis mutandis.

LIMITATION PERIOD

- 16. A prosecution for an offence under this bylaw may not be commenced after 60 days from the time when the subject matter of the prosecution arose.

REPEAL


17. Bylaw No. 152 is hereby repealed.
